Supervisor's Report

What a difference a year makes when it comes to the weather! Last year's drought seems so long ago. We have certainly gotten our share of rain so far this year. Let's hope for a nice fall season.

Later this month the Town Board will begin working on the 2018 budget. To begin the process, all departments and other entities that provide services to the town are asked to submit their budget requests to the Town Board for review. Over the course of 2-3 full days, the Town Board meets with all interested parties to review and justify their budget requests. After we have met with all interested parties, a "tentative" budget is created and then put forth to the Town Clerk. The Town Board reviews this document, makes any necessary changes, and then moves it to a "preliminary" budget. A public hearing is then scheduled wherein the public can comment on the proposed budget. After the public hearing, the Board may make additional changes that are deemed necessary. At this point, the final budget for the upcoming year is adopted. I want to thank everyone involved in this process, as a great deal of time and effort are spent in creating a budget that is both effective and practical.

The Town recently received notification from NYSERDA that they have approved our second Clean Energy Communities Program action item. Once an action item is completed, the Town must submit it to NYSERDA for approval. We also received the \$2,500 check from NYSERDA for adopting the unified solar permit. This streamlines the permitting process for residential solar projects. Look for more information on the unified solar permit in this newsletter.

All permits are in hand for the Mill Seat South landfill expansion. Monroe County is the permit holder and Waste Management is the operator under the permits. At the time of this writing, construction on Mill Seat South has yet to begin. The wetland mitigation project south of Bovee Road has commenced.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our planning and zoning board attorney Mel Olver for his many years of dedicated service to the Town of Riga. Mel has recently stepped aside in this capacity, and will be greatly missed. Mel was appointed as the Town's planning and zoning attorney on July 6th, 1988. He has helped the Town in so many ways over the years.

Streamlined Solar Permitting

To become a Clean Energy Community, the Town of Riga under the guidance of Supervisor Brad O'Brocta and in cooperation with the building department, implemented a Unified Solar Permit, which is available on the Town of Riga website. The unified solar permit is a standardized permit application designed to streamline the approval process for installing small scale solar projects in town properties, outside the village. The standardized permit will cut costs and create more competition with installers that may have typically stayed away from government red tape, and

lengthy municipal applications. The industry estimates that the permit dance adds an average of \$2500 in costs to each installation. Streamlining the department, implemented a process can provide significant stimulus to the solar power market.

An expedited process will allow these standard systems to pass quickly through the review process, freeing up time and money for all involved parties. This will result in decreasing the overall time for residents, allowing non-standard systems the necessary time for detailed review.

Obtaining A New York State Dog License

It is a state law, as well as a Town Ordinance, that all dogs 4 months and older must have a current NYS dog license. A dog license may be obtained at the Riga Town Offices during regular business hours, or you can apply by mail. To have a dog license application mailed to you, please call me at 293-3880 Ex121. In order to license your dog, you will need to provide a valid rabies certificate and a spay/neuter certificate, if applicable. The fee is \$9.00 for altered dogs and \$17.00 for un-altered dogs. If you have any questions, please call me at the above number.

Attention Multiple Dog Owners

Riga's Town Ordinance requires residents who own five (5) or more dogs to obtain a special-use permit. For more information on how to obtain a special use permit, please call the Town Clerk's office at 293-3880 x121.

As most know this has been one beginning the fourth mowing this month.

We have remained ten inches above average rainfall most of the summer. Rain delays in planned work have been the norm this summer, quite the oposite of last

summer. Roadside mowing has not had a break other than when we are needing Steve to help on construction projects. The new tractor mower setup has been working well and eliminates multiple passes to get all the hard to cut weeds. We have been through the entire town (town and county roads) three times and are

County Roadwork-

Attridge Road:

Some drainage issues (cross culverts) were repaired or replaced over the last month and the section north of railroad has been paved. South of railroad tracks to Rt 33A will be spot true and leveled in the coming weeks.

North Main Street- Brew Roads:

These county roads have been paved with NovaChip®/


Palmer Road:

We often do not have the personnel to complete these large projects for the County and in our towns without cooperative effort by many towns and their equipment. I am thankful for this effort by surrounding town highway departments as we are able to achieve much working together cooperatively benefiting our residents.

Brush and Limb Pickup:

We are planning our fall brush pickup for the week of October 16th. This will be a town wide **outside** of the village pick-up with no appointment necessary. Please have all limbs at the roadside before October 16th. We will only make **one trip** through the Town on your road so please have your limbs to the roadside prior to the 17th when we begin! All limbs (up to 8" in diameter) must be placed neatly with cut ends toward the road, at the edge of the road. Please **Do Not** block or cut the limbs into short lengths. We **cannot** accommodate construction debris, wood with nails, roofing, plastic materials, metal, dirt and boulders. If you have construction materials to get rid of call one of the many disposal companies in the area for a roll off dumpster. This date is tentative, depending on weather conditions and unforeseen emergency road repairs.

Kendall / Gilman Roads:

True and leveled last summer. These roads were chip sealed earlier in the summer.

Malloch Road:

Shoulders will be cut to allow water to drain off road surface and edges. True and leveling will take place later this summer.

Robertson Road :

From Palmer to Burnt Mill we have milled edges and filled with binder to widen and improve the base. Shoulders have been shaved to allow water to drain off roadway. We will be true and leveling to prep for chip seal next summer.

Town Roadwork-

Chip seal has been completed on North Sanford and Bovee Roads. The town's section of Kendall Road is scheduled to be in-place recycled and reprofiled in the next few weeks. This project is one that has moved due to rain. Culvert relining or replacement under Percy Road requires permits from DEC and Army Corps of Engineers and will likely occur next summer.

So how did Churchville Park come to be? That question will be answered in the next series of newsletter articles, starting at the beginning with an 1928 article from the Rochester Times Union newspaper, titled:

"CHURCHVILLE PARK TO BE PURCHASED FOR COUNTY PLAYGROUND."

"The Churchville park on Black Creek will be the second in the system of Monroe County parks, Mead B. Rappleye, secretary of the park commission, announced today. (Historians note: Officially, the first Monroe County Park was that of Ellison Park in 1926. Two hundred acres was donated to the county by Mr. and Mrs. Frank T. Ellison in memory of Mr. Ellison's father, Nathaniel.)

The property consisting of 500 acres of land and 400 of water, will cost approximately \$96,000. Members of the Monroe County Park Commission, the secretary, foreman of parks and the park committee of Monroe County Board of Supervisors, inspected the proposed park this afternoon. The park will include the dam, woodland will be ready for use

The paper box company property, including the dam, lake, about nine acres of land and a \$400 a year water rental from the New York Central Railroad, will cost approximately \$20,000, Mr. Rappleye said. Other plots adjacent to the village will be used for entrances and parking areas and amounting to about 43

acres of land, will cost around \$17,000, it was said. The balance of the area, consisting of farm and woodland, has been optioned at from \$63 to \$181 per acre. A number of the properties have houses and farm buildings on them which will be later sold by the commission.

Members of the Churchville Chamber of Commerce who were active in procuring options on the land, beside Mr. Mallock, are Raymond H. Combs, A.W. Aradine, H. P. Snyder, Charles Dewey, William Lehman and Frank F. Adams.

The party of inspectors was invited to attend the seventh annual dinner given this evening by the agricultural department of the Churchville High School, at which Assemblyman Joseph R. Hanley is to be the speaker."
